## Hocktoberfest goes green

One hundred and 22 female hockey teams will begin play today in the second annual Hocktoberfest Female Hockey Festival.

Games are being held in Tec-umseh, Essex, LaSalle, Windsor Arena, South Windsor Arena, Forest Glade and the WFCU Centre.

Among the new wrinkles in this year's festival are the creation of an atom (10-year-olds) division and a move to make the tournament more green.

An Ontario Trillium Foundation grant of \$50,000 has allowed the tournament to go paperless.

All results will be available at the rinks on big screens and laptop computers.

In addition, participants can take hybrid shuttle buses which will be doing a regular loop around the arenas and hotels.
